Welcome to the fortieth issue of the BEST prayer newsletter. A few more bible colleges and universities are hoping and planning to open their doors to students soon, after running teaching online for the past year. Others are expecting to continue with online classes for the time being, with one college in Ethiopia not expected to re-open until the next academic year.

In Santiago, Chile, our new study partner at the **Centre for Pastoral Studies** is **Diego Rivera**. He is studying the three-year Bachelor of Theology course, in preparation for leading churches in the upper sector of Viña del Mar, Valparaiso, which are without a pastor at the moment. This work will include pastoral care and teaching the bible, training leaders and discipling believers.





Jacqueline Tolley is now in her third year of the Bachelor of Theology course at the Centre for Pastoral Studies but she is having to engage through online teaching from her home in Argentina. Coronavirus restrictions do not allow classes to be held on campus and Jacqueline (and her husband Kidum) have recently moved to

Mendoza (western Argentina). They are serving at a church in Mendoza that is led by mission partner Andrew Walker.

Uganda Baptist Seminary in Jinja opened its doors to a small cohort of students in January – primarily those who were unable to finish their courses in 2020. Gradually they are welcoming back other students, including Gerald Ludhuba (pictured far right) who will recommence his Bachelor of Theology course in May. New study partner Daniel Kuku Kuti (pictured right will begin the Bachelor of Theology course in July – more than a year later than planned because of the COVID-19 restrictions.
